It was agreed to at an earlier meeting that the main runway at the Sid Bray field should be realigned to the east to try to keep aircraft away from the new housing development to the northwest. As soon as it can be arranged to have the mowing done realignment will happen. It will not be a big change but we hope it will be sufficient at this time. Flight paths will be monitored and we can make further adjustments if required. It is almost certain that if a model should end up in the housing development by accident or carelessness we would lose the field. It is up to the members to stay right away from the housing development.

Sitting around the tables at the flying fields and discussing what you would like to happen is a waste of time and has no chance of ever happening if you do not come to the meetings and put your proposals forward.

A Fly-Market auction will happen after the November meeting so bring all your unwanted models, gear etc to swap, sell or give away. There are usually some great bargains to be had. Graham Tattersall has kindly agreed to conduct the auction once again.



## Minutes of meeting & AGM August 28th 2015

The meeting commenced at 7.30pm, attendance as per the sign in book.

Apologies :- Ray Garcia, Gordon Barnett, Will Hall, Col Parry, Geoff Hunwick.

Previous minutes were read, Moved **Peter Atkinson**, Sec, **Graham Tattersall**. Passed.

The president updated the status of Bray Field with the information that was available to him. There is the possibility we could be secure here for up to eight years. The status of Uhlmann Rd:- The club is now on a community lease whereby the assets at the field have been taken over by the Council. The club however will still be responsible for the upkeep and insurance of such assets.

New members were introduced to the club .

Treasurers report:- The status of club finances was read out . Moved **G. Tattersall**, seconded **D. Anderson**, that the report be accepted. Passed.

CFI report:- no incidents.

Uhlmann Road update by **Graham Tattersall**. The tractor is now based there and is working well with large areas of grass slashed. The new water tank and associated pump have been delivered and are to be installed. The associated concrete slab will be poured.

**DANGER:** There has been UNAUTHORISED access to the main battery system by some person to charge their model batteries. The terminals were left unconnected. This practice is very dangerous and exposure to high voltage is possible.

This is not acceptable and the main batteries are not to be accessed for other than maintenance reasons by authorised members. Strong action will be taken if any members does this again.



Two models have been flown over the road and gun club . This is prohibited by CASA regulations and our club rules. Please take more care.

The working bee has been changed to Uhlmann Rd in lieu of Bray Field and now on the 13<sup>th</sup> due to Father's day falling on the same date.

**Paul Dalton** has resettled in NZ and has kindly donated 2 models to the club to be used for training purposes. Necessary gear updates in the models will be carried out prior to their use, as required.

**Dick Hall** spoke on the subject of the Airwaves newsletter and has again requested all editorial material , pictures, sales adds, etc be sent to him by no later than the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. Later than this and it will not go into Airwaves for that month.

**Greg Petherick** gave an update on the seaplane flying at lake Samsonvale. Things there are in a state of flux with a resolution hopefully near at hand.

**Nev Vogler** requested that people be aware that women and children are sometimes at the field. Please refrain from using bad language if you notice people of the opposite gender or children within earshot.



IMAC, Pattern and other flying competition matters, with regards to the use of our fields, were discussed.

**Dan Imhoff** tendered a nomination for president but was not present. A nomination was received from the floor from **Barry Evans**. A show of hands elected **Barry Evans** as president.

No nomination was received for secretary. **Andrew Holloway** consented to continue as secretary to fill the casual vacancy for the short term.

**Russell Ramsay** nominated and was elected unopposed as Treasurer.

The two positions on the general committee were filled by **Peter Atkinson** and **Graham Tattersall**.

**Greg Petherick** will continue as PRO.

The AGM closed at 8.25pm with no further business discussed.
