

Laser Cutting Machine Available

Bob's new Laser machine is now up and running. On his website (www.wolfmodels.net) he'll be listing the plans that he has in stock waiting for cutting short kits. The size he can cut is 2200mm long x 1200mm wide. So if you need a long fuselage side cut in one piece he can do it with ease. Send him your plan, either paper

or electronic, and he will generate all the parts in Autocad and cut the kit for you. If you want a model scaled up or down he can do that as well. The cost for scaling up or down will be a

little bit higher, but not excessive. He's aiming to keep the cost as low as possible. If you can send him a DXF file the cost of cutting the kit is significantly reduced. Bob has extensive experience in model planes and knows what you want.

Plywood thicknesses have in stock are. Basswood 3 ply 1.5mm, 2mm, 2.5mm, 3mm, Birch 3 ply 4mm and 6mm.



All laser cut kits are short kits and only include all **formers and ribs**, no sheeting, spars, cowls, canopies, wheel pants, fittings, fuel tank or wing tubes **unless otherwise stated**. I dropped in to his Man Cave recently and took these photos. If you are ever on the Warrego on the way to Toowoomba he's easy to find and only a couple of minutes up the road from

the Freedom Petrol station. When you see the sign in the paddock on the left that says "Boat Licence Call Dave" you can see his "office". Take the Habban Road exit and you'll find him. Wolf Models offer 5% discount to members.

As many members would be aware, the **Australian Miniature Aerosport Society** was established in 2012 to provide an attractive alternative to the Model Aeronautical Association of Australia (MAAA). The association has grown rapidly since its inception and continues to attract hundreds of new members from all flying disciplines. There is also a number of SAAMBR members who have heard of AMAS but don't know much about the association. In the June issue of Airwaves there were links to their latest newsletter which helped to explain a number of confusing issues.

Brief Features and Benefits to AMAS members include:

- Direct membership to a national society where your vote counts
- * Comprehensive insurances for members and clubs
- * A flying competency (wings) program
- * Instructor's courses for our clubs
- * Affordable membership from just \$28.00 for juniors and \$58.00 for seniors for 2014-15.
- Club affiliation for just \$12.00
- No fees being paid to executive committee.

It is acknowledged that SAAMBR members have expressed considerable interest in what AMAS has to offer and many have expressed a desire to seek exclusive AMAS membership. For this reason the constitution has been changed as mentioned in the last edition of Airwaves. This is not a decision taken lightly and considerable thought and discussion amongst members was taken at previous meetings. It has been observed that in a club of around 240-260 members, only about 10% regularly attend meetings. Those who do not may not be up to date with information on AMAS and what they have to offer. Meeting commenced: 7:35pm

Previous minutes – correct as published in Airwaves.

Moved: Barry Evans. Seconded: Darryl Thomas. All members in favour

Business arising from previous minutes: Nil

Presidents Report: The President reminded the meeting of the pending annual BBQ in July

and advised those intending to attend to place their names on the list at the field.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary welcomed new members: David Parella, Robert McGuire,

Edward Holmes, Gary Hodges and Graham Emery.

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer offered up a written treasurers report current as at

27/06/2014..

CFI Report: The CFI introduced himself to the new members and congratulated Bruce Parker and Robert Trelour on successfully completing their bronze wings.

He went on to remind members not to leave chairs in the pilot area.

Fuel Report: Bob Moore advised that there is plenty of fuel available.

Pro Report: North Pine Dam - Greg advised his deliberations with the North Pine Dam Sailing club have resulted in approval for 6 SAAMBR members to join the club to become key holders permitting flying at the dam. There will be a trial period commencing in July. The meeting discussed the issue of plane retrieval from water and the provision of a retrieval boat was discussed.

Airwaves: Dick Hall thanked members for their contributions to the magazine and asked they keep their articles coming.

Social visits: Paul Dalton advised that the next social outing is scheduled for the 20 July when members will attend at Lockyer Valley with flying to commence from 9:30am. Those wishing to attend other clubs on a social basis please contact Paul for details of pending outings.

Morayfield display: Graham Kennedy attended at Morayfield shopping centre to finalise insurance details for out pre-air show display in September. . He advised that our allocated site is outside the Kmart store and that we display at the centre without cost. Graham is looking for members to man the display and to provide aircraft so if you have an aircraft you wish to display and can give some time please place your name on the rosters at Sid Bray Field.

Motion that all reports be accepted as read. Moved: Barry Evans. Seconded: Dave Anderson: All members in favour.

General Business

Signage: Ian Swadling requested that permanent signs be erected on the new road to the field and advises that we need to seek approval to place temporary signs throughout the new estate on show day.

Defibrillator: Pat Dunne advised the meeting about the defibrillator for Life program and resolved to forward the details to Brad for further consideration.

Nationals: Pat Dunne enquired re the nationals competition to be held next year, asking if we had been approached re hosting elements of the competition. He was advised that SAAMBR have not received ant invitation to host by MAAQ.

Removal of 'charity' from air show: Jim Fagan sought to clarify details contained in Airwaves that our pending airshow is not to be a charity event. This was confirmed by the President. Uhlmann Road development: Dave Mont addressed the meeting regarding the Uhlmann road field stating that the strip was not suitable for all types of aircraft. He advised that he had priced sandy loam and topsoil at a cost of \$2400and suggested that we start work to smooth them out. Jeff Hunwick supported the need to top dress the strips at Uhlmann Road but went on to advise that it is the wrong time of year to undertake such work. Ian Swadling suggested that we move the roller from Sid Bray to Uhlmann Road. Dave Anderson stated that the use of steel rio was used successfully at other clubs to maintain smooth surfaces. Peter stated that he had received advice from green keepers who advised that sandy loam was required.

Jeff Hunwick enquired about a club house for the Uhlmann Road field. The President advised that the plan is to develop the field in stages and this is progressing.

Jeff expressed concerns about neighbouring properties at Sid Bray Field and predicted an 'electric only' future prompting the need to develop Uhlmann Rd to accommodate I/C flyers. The president reminded the meeting of the need for models over 7kg to remain within the revised flying boundaries.

UAV Challenge: Collin Flemingham provided a very informative address to the meeting about his experience competing in the UAV competition with Meuller College. He advised that Anthony Banks, of Meuller College had won an award for his flying program at Meuller. Those seeking further information about the challenge can do so Googling Meuller Aviation.

Constitution changes: Dick Hall asked as to the progress of changes to the SAAMBR constitution and what the future held. The President advised that the club was to remain with MAAQ for the pending membership year, however the removal of references to outside associations would provide an opportunity to disassociate in future if it is what the members desire. He stated that MAAQ/MAAA have not provided much to the club and have pushed the club into a corner. With membership renewal pending the MAAA insisted that all members of the club be affiliated with them just last week. SAAMBR will look further into options and will make a decision based on a club vote early in the New Year prior to the renewals period. Ian Swadling suggested that the committee enter into formal talks with other clubs to negotiate our future arrangements. Discussion was had regarding MAAA/MAAQ policy and resolved that their policies are disadvantaging our members.

Warbirds: Dave Mont advised Southern Cross Warbirds at Logan on 13 July for one day only and Coolum warbirds is scheduled for 2 and 3 August.

Field hire: The President asked members to consider the hiring out of our field/facilities to special interest groups as a means to raise funds. The matter is to be discussed at the next general meeting.

Uhlmann Road wind sock: Barry Evans is to replace the wind sock at Uhlmann Road.

Motion: That the club allocate \$660 required for 6 club members to affiliate with the North Pine Dam Sailing Club to provide access to SAAMBR members.

Moved: Barry Evans, Seconded: Jim Fagan, Motion carried. A ballot with be held to permit a fair distribution of subsidised memberships to the m Sailing Club.
